Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes

I planted, Apollos watered, but God made it grow. Because of this, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but the only one who is anything is God who makes it grow. The one who plants and the one who waters work together, but each one will receive their own reward for their own labor. We are God's coworkers, and you are God's field, God's building.

- 1 Corinthians 3:6-9

I enjoy puttering around in my gardens. Although I am not a master gardener, nor do I have the acumen for the nuances of plant health, I do enjoy the hard work of creating garden beds and seeing what might flourish in those environments.

I have made a lot of gardening mistakes.

Last year, I especially remember planting something marked "full sun" in a full sun spot, but the searing heat was just too much for it. This year I transplanted it to a nearby spot that had some shade. Although the plant is weathering the challenges of being transplanted, it is flourishing in its new home. Meanwhile, other plants have taken its full sun spot and seem to enjoy the searing heat and constant sun.

Then there is the watering.

One of the reasons I try to plant things that will naturally flourish is because I don't want to get involved in excessive watering. Some of this is from a personal environmental philosophy (Remember when I said that my original training was in environmental toxicology? That stuff is pretty stuck in my DNA.), but some of it is also simply because I don't want to commit to the extensive practices. Either way, the commitment to the plants does involve some degree of watering as well as tending the garden beds. As I consider my work, I spend time negotiating with myself on what I am willing to maintain. Without my commitment, the plants will struggle.

Yet even with all of that work, I can not guarantee the plants will grow.

One of the things I love most about gardening is that although I can do all the hard work of creating garden beds, planting things, and watering, I cannot guarantee what will grow. The growth of a plant is a sign of pure grace.

I also cannot force how fast a plant will grow.

Plants will grow at their own speed. Perennials will establish themselves according to their own timelines. Although I can plant, tend, and water, their growth is beyond me.

Gardening is good for my soul. Working with the plants reminds me of the importance of responsible, cooperative grace. I am needed. My work matters. Yet the ultimate results are way beyond my powers. Only God can really make it grow.



Mount Olivet Conference & Retreat Center is a place of exceptional beauty. Rolling hills, prairies, and woods invite guests to connect with nature as a theater of grace. Guests hike on five miles of trails, venture out on the marsh walk (a 425-foot floating walkway overlooking Chub Lake), meditate in the gazebo, pray in the outdoor chapel, walk the outdoor labyrinth, spy on ducks in the wildlife observation blind, or enjoy conversation over a fire on the patio. Wildflower and rainwater gardens, scattered throughout the grounds, highlight the retreat center's natural beauty and commitments to land preservation.

Most of the food is made from scratch and sourced locally. They have an organic garden on site where they harvest fresh fruit and vegetables during the summer months. They get vegan protein from a vegan deli in Minneapolis. They can accommodate gluten free, dairy free, vegetarian, vegan, and other dietary needs/restrictions.






Camp Minnesota

The Project Management Team (PMT) is working diligently with the trustees to get our capital campaign projects in motion.

We are pleased to announce that over \$170,000 has already been collected to-wards our capital campaign projects, which means we are able to proceed with several projects right now.
